Chow's 4 RBIs powers Geckos over Coyotes 16 -7 Nelson homers in losing effort

I n some ways it's a bit surprising the score was as close as it was. Yes, the Geckos piled up 10 more hits than the Coyotes, batting .694 vs. the Coyotes .454, but better Coyote defense could have made a major difference as well. The Geckos scored 4 runs in the 1st when sub *Licata* and *Savage* singled in 2 before *Chow's* double drove in 2 more. The Coyotes didn't get on the board until the 3rd when *Nelson's* homer drove in *Hayward* ahead of him for their first 2. But it's hard to stay in contact when the other guy keeps putting up 4s as the Geckos did in the 3rd, 5th and 6th innings. *Nelson* led the Coyotes with 4 RBIs while *Savage* had 3 behind *Chow's* 4.

Down 3 going into the 7th, the Rams scored 5 runs on key hits by White (3B), McCarthy, Peterson, Grace and Rhodes before Jacobsen's two out, 2-run, coup-de-gras single.

Riddle has monster day as Bobcats maul Raptors 20-13

 \mathbf{F} rankly, no one could have beaten the Bobcats today. Heck, *Mike Riddle* alone might have (4/4, 3 dbls, triple), beaten anyone. But when you add *DiMarco's* 6 RBIs, you pretty much have the makings of a rout on your hands. Think of this: the team sent 36 people to the plate, 29 of whom wound up on 1st base, or better. That's an unheard of .805 average, despite not counting walks as hits this season.
